

LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN 7

This newsletter has been deliberately delayed so that the results of the leagues and club competitions could be included. The club competitions this year produced some surprise results, which is good for the club. The standards of the club competitions rose this year so reaching the club finals was a significant achievement, which is the way that it should be in a club of our size. All the club competition finalists and the league winning teams and runners up are invited to the Club Presentation Evening on Friday 3rd May.

Those of you who visited the club over the weekend of 23rd and 24th March saw some excellent matches between 96 bowlers in the Open Singles Circuit Competition. The winner was 18 years old Jack Breen from Cynon Valley IBC. Last year the winner was a 16 year old so maybe something is happening in the world of the Open Singles Circuit bowls!

Whilst I would not normally raise the issue of disciplinary matters it is important for members to be aware that dealing with these when they arise is an important part of the board of directors role. The board always maintain complete silence whilst resolving these issues whereas members sometimes choose to express their personal point of view within the club. Resolving these issues invariably results in either a full apology from the member or they leave the club.

Looking at more positive aspects of the club I am pleased to be able to advise that the club will be coaching classes from two junior schools leading to a junior schools tournament between these two schools. The two primary schools involved are Ashton Vale and Compass Point and their coaching sessions will be on Tuesday mornings from 4th to 25th June from 9.30 to 12.00. The tournament between these two schools will be held on the morning of Saturday 29th June and if you can spare the time it would be good to see club members supporting this event. We have been trying to start a school tournament for seven years and at last it will be happening this summer. We hope that this will encourage more primary schools to become involved in the future with the benefit that we could see an increase in the number of juniors attending the Saturday morning coaching.

The juniors have now returned from their trip to Ireland over the weekend of 6th/7th April, where they encountered stiff opposition from the other teams but managed to win four matches and draw another. All the junior costs are covered by the junior fund raising activities and it is appreciated how much support members provide to swell that fund.

The car parking agreement with Trust Ford is now in its final stages with all the licence agreements signed and a planned start date of May1st. There is a plan on the main notice board showing how the final car parking will be arranged. In the short term Trust Ford staff will utilise the car parking spaces along the side of the building until the alterations have been completed to the rear parking bays, road markings installed and notices posted. It is inevitable that there will be a few issues in the early days of this new arrangement and members support is sought to be tolerant where any teething problems occur. The benefit to the club of this licence agreement is significant and it is hoped that it will continue for many years.

May I wish all members who are now bowling at their outdoor clubs a warm and dry summer. To those playing at the club in the summer I wish you a most enjoyable bowling experience in the air conditioned environment. An evening bowls session will now be available on Thursday evenings for members to have roll ups and particularly to satisfy the request from working members that the club is open at least one evening for them to continue bowling indoors during the summer.
