Thanks to Club members for the support shown for the Club which opened on 1st. September for the first time since March.

At the time of writing, membership renewals were at around 431 plus 24 new memberships, which is better than we dared to hope after such long layoff, and with Government restrictions still in place. This number will be boosted when the league programmes start on 5 October, and some members have indicated that they will rejoin in the New Year.

The Board of Directors have not been idle during the shutdown, restructuring the Club's finances and negotiating better utilities contracts to protect the viability of the Club for the foreseeable future, barring any further Government restrictions being imposed.

It is encouraging to see members adhering to social distancing and the temporary changes to playing practices. It is important that we continue to observe these changes so that we can return to normality as soon as possible.

UMBRELLA'S ON THE MOVE

CONFUSED? YOU'RE NOT ALONE

Just to clarify the situation about face coverings in the Club.



Face coverings should be worn at all times when moving around the Club and in the changing rooms and toilets.

They may be removed when seated whilst eating/drinking.

They may be removed when on the rinks.

If you are exempt from wearing a face covering, you must maintain social distancing of 2 metres at all times.

CLUB TOUR 2021

The Club Tour to Torquay on 15^{th} - 18^{th} January 2021 is still very much ON.

The Hotel has full COVID precautions in place, and the playing times have been reduced similar to those at the Club. Play will start at 10am and finish at 5.30pm eliminating rushed breakfasts and late dinners. Coach travel to and from the hotel from the Club is included.

IT'S ALL IN THE TIMING

Players are still arriving more than fifteen minutes before their booked playing time, which is compromising hygiene practices.

The fifteen minutes at the end of a session are to allow finishing players to leave the rink and for the rink surrounds to be wiped down. There is not always sufficient staff or volunteer numbers to man reception and bar and to clean rinks simultaneously. The following fifteen minutes are to check in the incoming players who may then proceed to the changing rooms without crossing outgoing players.

Early arrivals can lead to backing up at reception and two sets of players in the changing rooms, leading to compromising of social distancing.

More volunteers are needed as the Club is becoming busier. More help in the Club could lead to relaxation of some of the timing issues, but in the meantime......
