WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS AT BIBC

It is pleasing to report that members have been extremely supportive in volunteering for the multitude of roles that are needed for us to run the World Bowls Championships in April. These take place from Monday 25th to Friday 29th April. Practice sessions start from Wednesday 20th April. The Falkland Islands team has already booked their practice sessions from Wednesday to Friday.

The club league season finishes on Friday 15th April so we have just four days to convert the club into a venue suitable for the event. This will include major seating changes and fitting the national flags of around 30 countries onto the rinkside walls.

There are six major groups and a further nine small groups of volunteers. Each major group will have two team leaders and they will shortly be invited to a meeting to explain their roles and team members. They will then contact the members in their group, explain the role and prepare a rota so that we have all activities covered every day. At a later date, once we have all the final details, all volunteers will be invited to a major meeting

It is proposed that we make this event exemplary and further details how we plan to do this will be advised in due course. Each volunteer will be wearing grey trousers and a club shirt. We plan to provide each volunteer with a badge (see photograph on Page 4) and to display volunteer photograph montages. Could all the volunteers please help by advising reception what first name they want on their badge e.g Michael or Mike, and to check that their photograph stored on the membership system at reception is good quality.

All the countries have to submit their entry forms by the middle of February following which we will be meeting with representatives of World Bowls, the International Indoor Bowls Council and the English Indoor Bowls Association, to finalise details.

A limited number of tickets will be available a few weeks before the event so it is suggested that if you plan to attend you acquire your ticket in advance. These are free to club members who will need to show their membership cards on entry.

Exciting times for the club which will demonstrate that we are a fully International Indoor Bowls Club.

POSTPONED LEAGUE MATCHES

There are a considerable number of postponed league matches, due mainly to the virus, that remain unplayed.

Please arrange to play these matches as soon as possible as there are only eight weeks left in the season, with only a limited number of rinks available.

It is the responsibility of the team which postponed the match to arrange the times and should ideally offer their opponents a number of optional dates, and to arrange the rink booking once a date is agreed on. Wednesday evening may be a good opportunity to play these matches.

As a result of the backlog, it is possible that Roll -Ups which have been booked may have to be cancelled to accommodate the completion of League and Club Competition matches.

IMPROVEMENTS

As usual, the Club will be closed for the first two weeks in May for annual maintenance works to be carried out.

As part of these works, it is hoped to install a new carpet in the function room, using the uplifted carpet tiles to replace the patched areas in the lounge carpet and to replace the office carpet.
